Seattle will be hosting the 2011 Northwest Regionals of the competition and wants Washington to bring it strong! Homefield advantage makes a difference! Fresher beers, and let's face it, like palates taste alike!

The NHC is a two round competition. You first enter your regionals where you'll go up against brewers in our neck of the woods to qualify for the second round held at the National Homebrewers Conference (you only pay one entry fee). The top 3 beers scoring above 30 in each BJCP Category advance to the second round.

Because this is local, your beers will arrive fresh, well-treated, and be judged by a majority of judges that have a built-in appreciation for local flavor! The full details for the competition are available HERE
